Police Community Support Officer (PCSO)

I have been visited by two representatives of the Cheshire Police who discussed the cuts in funding that the Police are having to work with. They explained that, when the cuts start to affect them, one of the easiest ways to save money would be to seriously cut back the number of PCSOs employed by the force. Westminster Park is one of the safest and crime free areas in Chester and that, to a degree, is due to the work carried out by our PCSO - he also covers Curzon Park and Hough Green.

The Police are looking at ways to overcome this problem and they are looking at ways to raise the funds to cover one third of his salary. They have approached the Co-op with a view to them funding either all or part of the money required and they have also asked the local residents associations whether they could contribute to the 'pot'.

This was discussed at the WPRA Annual General Meeting and a resolution was passed that we would raise the annual subscription by £1.00 to cover our

Richard Short

A familiar and well-known name will be missing from the political scene around Westminster Park. Richard Short is not continuing as our Councillor after thirty years of representing our interests.

It was in 1980 that Richard was first elected to Chester City Council for Westminster Ward, which included Westminster Park and about two thirds of Lache. With the support of his late wife, Margaret, he soon became well known for his work in the area. Richard did not want to be just part of the background and within two years was Chairman of the Housing Committee, one of the most contentious and political parts of the Council. By 1990 he was leader of the Council, losing that position after the introduction of the poll tax. He soon recovered and played a major role in the Council with the acceptance of the two opposition groups, as there was no political party with overall control.

In 1995 Richard became Lord Mayor. This gave him great satisfaction because of the close contact with all the people and volunteers who make the City work. He has many great memories of that time. At the end of his Mayoral year Richard was defeated in the local elections, regaining the seat two years later.

Richard has always been willing to help and support the residents in our area. If there was a problem be it with blocked road drains, pot holes in the road, verges not being cut, trees needing to be replaced, hedge cutting, planning applications and, when required, helping residents with their individual problems.

On the first Saturday of every month he has been available outside the Westminster Park shops to chat to and listen to the concerns of local residents. Nothing has been too much trouble for him.

Richard was one of the founder members of our residents association and the first Chairman and he still remains on the Committee.

One thing he has not been successful in achieving (so far that is) is removing the ripples in the recently resurfaced Lache Lane! However, he is still trying to get this rectified.

Richard will be sorely missed.

Home Watch

Some parts of Westminster Park are covered by Home Watch schemes whilst others are not and some of the schemes are more active than others. A meeting of Home Watch coordinators was held at the end of March, with a Police representative, to exchange views, raise the profile of HW in the area and obtain Police support where appropriate.

It was agreed that we would work together as a group and circulate our contact details. One person attended who plans to set up a new group in her road and, after identifying the areas not covered by schemes, we agreed to encourage residents in these areas to set up their own schemes.

The Police email a weekly report containing details of criminal activity in the area and offering advice on how to combat crime. Although crime is low at present that is no reason to be complacent. HW coordinators receive the reports and can forward them on to their groups.

It was felt that we should obtain more HW stickers for residents to display in their windows, etc. The Police have now provided some and these can be obtained from your HW coordinator or from Brian Westcott.

We also discussed the use of Smartwater kits that enable people to treat all types of property from jewellery to TVs with a unique mark only visible to ultra violet light. This gives you a better chance of identifying stolen property recovered by the Police. We are able to buy these kits for £18 including VAT and will buy a batch if there is interest in doing so. Please let me know if you are interested.
