Bus stop improvements

As you know, the Westminster Park Residents' Association works to help the residents and improve the area generally. One matter which was brought to our attention earlier this year was the overgrown hedges and undergrowth by the bus stops along Wrexham Road – one on the same side as the Nuffield Hospital entrance and one on the opposite side of the road.

The overhanging bushes obliterated the sight of oncoming traffic, unless people stood right on the edge of the pavement. (The worst one being on the same side of the road as the Hospital going towards Wrexham where the pavement is very narrow at the best of times).



Anyone who has stood on the edge of the pavement at rush hour will appreciate how dangerous it is because of the very high volume of traffic especially at rush hour times – the lorries being the worst.

The bus stop along Hough Green at the end of Cavendish Road was also particularly dangerous, again caused by overhanging bushes and the undergrowth which covered over two thirds of the pavement. This particular pavement is used by hundreds of school children who often stepped out into the road if anyone was waiting at the bus stop!

The WP Residents' Association was asked if anything could be done about the situation and therefore a letter asking for the hedges to be cut back was written to our local councillors in June. Unfortunately nothing was done immediately, but our request was followed up again and we are pleased to report that the bushes have been cut back along Wrexham Road and Hough Green and also the pavements have been cleared of undergrowth making the areas safer and tidier.

Bins - all change again

Allan Stobie and I recently represented Westminster Park at a meeting convened to discuss the Council's proposed new waste collection system. It was arranged by our local councillors and included representatives from Queens Park, Handbridge, Hough Green and Curzon Park.

Cllr Lynn Riley, responsible for the Environment portfolio, started the meeting by explaining that the new Council had inherited three different systems from the District councils and that it had always been recognised that these would have to be rationalised.

It was explained that the Council has tendered and is on the point of appointing May Gurney to provide a waste collection service throughout CWaC from April. The aim is to harmonise the three systems, minimise cost, increase the amount of recycling from the current 49% up to 68% and provide a satisfactory service to residents.

The contract will be for 14 years and is expected to cost £126M, saving £50M on current costs over the life of the contract. The cost saving is partly due to the contractor's expectation of earning significant income from recycled products.

Many more items will be recycled. As well as those collected now, we will be able to recycle tetrapaks, printer cartridges, shoes, engine and cooking oil, and a range of other things. Sorting will take place at the kerbside rather than at the Bumpers Lane and other recycling plants - these will be sold off.

Our brown bins for non-recyclable rubbish will be replaced by slightly larger grey bins and will be collected fortnightly. Everything else will be collected weekly. The containers will be green bin for garden rubbish (unchanged), two boxes with lids for paper, tins, glass and other items (see above), and a small bin for food waste.

There was considerable discussion of the pros and cons of this system compared to the one currently operating in Chester with people particularly worried about lifting the boxes. . It was said that the box system already operates satisfactorily in Vale Royal and Ellesmere Port on a fortnightly basis and

boxes should be lighter given the proposed weekly collection. The Council is considering providing wheels to those who wish to purchase them and pointed out that an assisted collection service is available.

Apart from Christmas and New Year, the contractor will work on Bank Holidays so that there should be fewer interruptions to the service. The contract will commence in April 2012 but will not be implemented in Chester until the autumn.

The Council says it is keen to communicate the proposals to residents and hear their views. The WPRA will do its best to ensure that you are kept informed.

Belgrave Pre-school

Westminster Park's local pre-school, Belgrave Pre-school, has been established for over thirty years and is situated next door to Belgrave Primary School. It enjoys a close relationship with this popular school but is not linked and entry to the school is not automatic if a child joins the Pre-school.

Belgrave Pre-school is a registered charity, and it is managed by a Committee of parents who work closely with staff to shape and develop the pre-school.



Sessional care for children aged between 2 and 5 years, from Monday to Friday, 9 am to 12 pm is offered. The cost of a 3-hour session is £8.20 and this includes a snack.

The staff and volunteers (all of whom have been CRB checked) are committed to safeguarding every child and a safe and stimulating environment is provided in which children can develop and learn. Each child is actively encouraged to 'learn through play' - enabling them to thrive and have confidence in future learning situations. Resources and activities are linked to the Early Years Foundation Stage while providing for individual needs, abilities and preferences.

Activities are planned for children to work towards the Key Stage 1 Programme of the National Curriculum. These activities include: sand and water, painting, Playdough, puzzles and games, stories and songs and construction. An outdoor play area is also available.

The Pre-school is regulated by Ofsted and is a member of the Pre-school Learning Alliance (the umbrella organisation for pre-schools and nurseries). It is also in partnership with Sure Start, which provides government funding for children aged 3 and 4 years.

Outdoor gym officially unveiled in the Park

An outdoor gym, two running circuits and picnic benches have been officially unveiled at Westminster Park. The £53,000

Fields in Trust project was funded by Cheshire West and Chester Council and WREN.

WREN is a not for profit business that awards grants to community, environmental and heritage projects across the UK from funds donated by Waste Recycling Group, (WRG) as part of a voluntary environmental tax credit scheme called the Landfill Communities Fund. Fields in Trust is the only national charity whose core mission is to protect and safeguard outdoor recreational space for future generations to enjoy.

The outdoor gym project links to their legacy programme, the Queen Elizabeth II Fields Challenge, led by the Duke of Cambridge, which aims to protect 2,012 outdoor playing fields and parks by the end of 2012.

Councillor Stuart Parker, Executive Member for Culture and Recreation said: "Residents and park users chose their preferred outdoor gym equipment earlier this year. The finished project has proved enormously popular with everyone and the Council has received many positive comments."

Richard Smith, Grant Manager at WREN added "Westminster Park is an excellent resource for the local community and a number of improvements to the play area and multi-use games area have been funded by WREN in recent years. The outdoor gym is in a great location and really compliments the existing facilities; it also provides something for all ages to enjoy and is proving to be extremely popular."

Alison Moore-Gwyn, Chief Executive of Fields in Trust, said: "Outdoor gyms are a great way for everyone to be able to participate in exercise and reap the rewards of improved physical and mental health so we're delighted to be installing this facility in Chester on a Queen Elizabeth II Field."

Local Councillor Neil Sullivan said: "All the improvements to Westminster Park are enjoyed by local people and visitors and the scheme has proved to be extremely popular."
