Started in 2006, the Westminster Park Front Garden Competition is a popular annual event. We are lucky to have so many greenfingered residents in the area who take pride in their gardens.

The rules are very simple:

1. You do not need to enter. The judging panel automatically considers all 1200 front gardens in the Westminster Park Residents Association area.

2. Previous winners are not eligible for the following 4 years.

3. Gardens are judged by what can be seen from the public highway. It is important to note that we do not request/require access to your home or property.

Approximately 20/30 gardens are normally short listed for a second visit and letters will be delivered to every house on the shortlist.

The winner receives a small monetary prize and a shield, which they hold for the year. The runners up receive a small monetary prize.

# Neighbourhood Watch

There are a few people who question the usefulness of Neighbourhood Watch Schemes but there are times when looking out for your neighbours pays dividends.

Very recently a member of Lower Field Road Neighbourhood Watch Scheme was clearing out her garage when she observed a rather shifty looking individual, carrying a holdall, coming out of the garden gate of a neighbouring house, where the owner was at work. The individual, keeping his head down, left at some speed when he noted her watching him.

She immediately phoned the police and gave a detailed description of the individual then jumped in her car to slowly and safely follow him through the estate. As a result of her description and follow up action the police very shortly afterwards apprehended the individual, who was found to have jewellery and a jewellery case in his holdall. It transpires that, although he had not broken into her neighbours house, he had broken into an unoccupied house on Lache Lane, where the elderly lady owner was in hospital after having suffering a stroke, then jumped over the rear fence to make his exit through Lower Field Road. It further transpires that this individual's description and trainers etc., linked him to evidence gathered from a number of previous burglaries.

If it had not been for the vigilance of one of our residents who knows how long he could have carried on doing these burglaries. Let's hope the Justice System gives him his due comeuppance. Whilst I don't advocate following a suspicious individual in your car the act of phoning the police straight away, with a detailed description, could help apprehend a burglar. I think we are all guilty, in varying degrees, of looking the other way rather than confronting a situation like that. However a simple phone call could be the answer to helping keep our estate a low crime stat area.
