# Friends of Westminster Park

At the AGM of the Friends of Westminster Park in November 2012, Allan Stobie stood down after seven years as Chairman. He and the former secretary, Paul Makin, made a significant contribution to the development of Westminster Park through constant dialogue with the council and lobbying and chivvying whenever necessary to get things done and to help raise funds from a variety of external sources.

Since the year 2000, nearly £1m has been spent on significant improvement projects including the transformation of the former disused council nursery into a woodland area, drainage of the football pitches, the expansion and upgrading of the children's play area, a new multi-use games area (MUGA), a teenage recreation area, BMX track, a cricket pitch, a replacement croquet and bowls pavilion, an outdoor gym and jogging tracks. In addition, local schools and residents have helped with planting trees and spring bulbs and installing bird boxes. The result has been a substantial improvement in the quality and attractiveness of the park and it is now well used throughout the year. We are pleased that these achievements have been recognised by the park receiving a national Green Flag award. We are also pleased that Allan Stobie has agreed to remain a member of the committee representing the Westminster Park Residents Association.

In the more difficult financial climate we are now experiencing, the era of major projects is now probably past but there continues to be the important task of maintaining the facilities at a high standard and representing the community's views on priorities at a time when resources are more limited. Norman Trott as secretary and I as the new chairman are maintaining our close dialogue with the council. In this context we have been contributing to a Greenspace strategy review and the council's management plan for the park. We have also initiated discussions with Brio which is a new public interest company formed by the council to manage sports and recreation facilities across the borough

including the Northgate Arena, the Christleton Sports Centre, and the golf course and café in Westminster Park. We have impressed on them the need to restore the quality of the golf course and to offer a more appealing range of food and beverages in the café, and we have arranged regular meetings to monitor progress. We have also expressed concerns at the state of the toilets, which are managed by the council. On a more positive note we have been pleased to support a private venture proposal to re-instate and upgrade the putting green in front of the café.

We welcome your support in speaking for all users of the park and if you have views on issues that need attention or priorities for improvement do please pass them on to any member of the committee.

## **Cooking for comfort**

This time of year everybody enjoys some real comfort food. With the recent resurgence of slow cookers there has never been a better time to make tasty casseroles, pot roasts or stews. The beauty of slow cooking is that it lets you take advantage of the cheaper cuts of meat, which often have more flavour.

•Why not try shoulder of lamb as an alternative to the leg. Slow cooked on the bone until it falls apart or have it boned and rolled for easier carving.

•For a lamb casserole or tagine, the diced shoulder is perfect, try bulking it up with some neck of lamb, which adds even more flavour.

•Lamb breast is also a cheaper cut; cooked very slowly the fat will melt away.

Brisket beef is a real alternative to topside with its natural layer of fat it is full of flavour. Slowly pot roast in plenty of liquid to prevent it drying out.

•Shin beef has become very popular once more with many celebrity chefs rightly singing its praises. Cooked slowly on a low setting it will break down to give wonderful flavour.

•Lean mince can be used in so many ways, from cottage pie to bolognese, meatballs to burgers.

•Lean stewing steak is also a good seller at this time of year; this can be bulked up by the addition of lamb neck, which also adds more flavour.

•Pork is good value at the moment; slow roasted shoulder or belly pork with a layer of fat gives the best crackling.

Slow cooking generally takes very little effort once everything is prepared it is just a case of putting it in the pot and leaving it to it.
