News from your Councillors

Wrexham Road Development

The various planning applications are not yet scheduled to go to Planning Committee for consideration. There are ongoing communications between the developers, transport and other consultants and the Council Planning Department. Any resident can make representations about the applications at any time before the applications are considered at Planning Committee (see page 6 for details).

Chester Western Relief Road

We are continuing to push for the long contemplated Western Relief Road to come to fruition. We understand that Flintshire Council is now willing to work with Cheshire West and Chester Council on an initial feasibility study. This is welcome.

King's School

We met with local residents and the King's new Head at the school to discuss the ongoing heavy term time parking in Fir Tree Avenue and other roads. The Park and Ride option we arranged is not really being used much. There is no short term resolution in prospect at this point in time.

Buses

The very popular DB1 has a new service in place (61,62) with reduced buses. This is mainly due to withdrawal of funding from Flintshire Council. We have had to push our Council's Bus Department very hard to get some small improvements. We have

received many comments and concerns regarding the new bus services which we are feeding back to the Council Bus Department. We have asked for a meeting with them to discuss ways to improve the services.

PCSO Support

We have a new PCSO for our area - Tim Cooper. We look forward to working with him to keep our area safe and friendly.

what everyone will come up with next year!



It is anticipated that the Centre will be open for hire and use from 1st July.




Flooding concerns over new Meadow House planning application

People living close to Meadow House have expressed their worries about the potential for flooding as a result of a proposed new development in an orchard adjacent to the house.

Further to receiving outline planning consent to build 2 bungalows on the site, the owners of Meadow House have now submitted a planning application (18/00932/FUL) to build four, five-bedroom, two and a half storey houses on the same plot.

To the rear of this site is a deep pond which was found to be home to great crested newts, smooth newts and toads in a 2015 survey.

Residents are concerned that plans regarding surface drainage are inadequate and that flooding of the pond will result. This in turn could cause flooding of their properties too.
