go to Committee in January

It seems for ever that we have been commissioned consultants to review this. publishing articles here about the threatened development of around 1400 properties on published. the former green belt land between Westminster Park and the Wrexham Road.

We initially opposed the development on the grounds that Chester did not need so many new houses there and we still believe this to be the case.

However, events have moved on. Redrow and Taylor Wimpey have submitted planning applications - the layout of the proposed development can be seen in the window of the WP pharmacist, at Lache Library and at the traffic issues, education and health the Council offices.

The WPRA and many individuals have submitted comments and objections to the Council, but it now appears that it will be considered at a Planning Committee meeting on Monday, 8 January.

One of the main issues has always been the effect on traffic congestion from such a large development and the Council

Wrexham Road New Housing

We continue to work with Westminster Park Residents' Association on the planning applications. It looks as if the applications will go to Planning Committee on 8 January. Residents can still submit responses to them. **Members' Budget**

We were pleased to use our Members' budget to help fund new Christmas lights, a Christmas tree, a sign for Westminster Park Community Centre and also the revamp of the rear of the Community Centre.

The Council is consulting on next year's budget. It is an opportunity for residents to make their views known. You can comment on the draft budget proposals for 2019-20 and emerging ideas for 2020-24. Your feedback will help inform the final budget decisions.
