Deva Podiatry

Westminster Park has now got a fully equipped ground floor chiropody clinic with plenty of easy parking.

New book by local author -Chester at Work by Stewart Shuttleworth This book, appropriately

launched at Telford's Warehouse, details and portrays (in 158 pictures)

how work in Chester has evolved to today's service industries such as tourism, retail, public administration and financial services.

This was not always the case, given the city's location on the River Dee and its strategic military position. Chester was a port with ancillary industries from Roman times. In the mid eighteenth century the port declined due to silting of the Dee and the rise of Liverpool. However, some port-related industries remained and a reduced amount of shipping continued into the twentieth century.

Stewart Shuttleworth (a Marlston Avenue resident) traces the changes in the city's working life from its pre-industrial beginnings, through the Industrial Revolution right up to the present day. This book will interest those who know the city and want to discover more about its rich heritage from an industrial and social perspective.


