# Wrexham Road Site Application

At the Planning Committee meeting on 23 January we objected to the Outline Planning Application for up to 1400 homes on Wrexham Road. We urged the Committee to reject it, or restrict the number to the 1269 already permitted. Our reasons concerned an inadequate infrastructure and lack of mitigation unless a third crossing of the River Dee is achieved. Other issues included flooding, air quality, no bungalows or community centre and the safety of pedestrians crossing Wrexham Road at Ash

# Friends of Westminster Park

Since our lively AGM in November, things have begun to happen in the Park... In the car park, the worst of the potholes have been filled in and a long-term plan is under development for that area's general improvement. New waste bins have been installed, bringing a uniformity of design and a much better receptacle for holding the general rubbish deposited.

The Safe Dog Walking Area project is about to be realised; following a frustratingly lengthy process, our CWaC support team has finally obtained funding for the work and a fence and gates will be installed in March.

Most recently, the perimeter hedges, which are adjacent to residents' houses, are being cut back to approximately 8 feet in height. This is improving the overall appearance of the Park and will make ongoing maintenance much easier. Finally, on 25 March you will see a large group of volunteers (from Lloyds Bank) planting new trees as part of an initiative linked with the Woodland Trust.

# Lache and Westminster Park Local History Group

The Building of the Roman Catholic Metropolitan Cathedral, Liverpool Speaker: Philip Harrison



After many false starts, from the mid 19th century onwards Liverpool finally gained its second iconic cathedral in 1967, when the building that we see today was consecrated.

Philip Harrison was closely involved in its

The Society is a charity providing educational opportunities for members to learn to sing, act and dance. Formed in 1922 it has performed musical shows, light operas and concerts in Chester every year since.

We were the first amateur company to perform on the main stage of Storyhouse with "Singing in the Rain" in 2018.

This year we are again putting on a show in Storyhouse from 24 to 27 June with "Made in Dagenham", a witty musical following the events surrounding the women seamstresses at Ford which led to the Equal Pay Act in 1970 - fifty years ago.

On 2 and 3 October a concert "Rhythm of Life" will be held at St Mary's Creative Space containing excerpts from 20th C musicals. Finally we will put on our ever popular

design and construction. After gaining a Diploma at the Leeds School of Architecture he joined the London based architectural practice of Frederick Gibberd as his personal assistant, working on detailed designs for the cathedral. Between 1964 and 1968 he was Resident Site Architect during construction.

This is not so much a technical talk, more of 'a trip down memory lane', with personal anecdotes of events during construction from an architect deeply involved in one of Liverpool's modern spectacular buildings.
