New housing proposed for Winkwell Drive field

A new proposal to construct housing on a designated Local Wildlife Site between Lache Lane and Winkwell Drive has been met with a considerable number of objections from local residents.

The site, currently a meadow with a pond, is home to several rare species including protected great crested newts.

A consultation leaflet, distributed to residents living nearby, outlined a plan to build 21 new dwellings on 70 per cent of the land. The pond and some grassland would be retained and enhanced. Entrance to the new development would be via a drive off Lache Lane.

It is intended that the housing would be a mix of property types from 1 to 5 bedrooms and include 30 per cent affordable homes, all built to a high standard.

Some aspects of the proposal were viewed positively by residents – the retention of the pond and grassland, the mix of housing, and no through access from Winkwell Drive to Lache Lane.

However, many of our residents do not support the plans and had many objections and questions. In summary, they are:

- ◆ This is a Local Wildlife Site which supports amphibians, bats, hedgehogs, etc. Any design for the development of this site should have the preservation of this habitat at its core, ensuring that protected species are not lost. Studies of the biodiversity of the site should underpin the plan and the area available for development (if any) can then be determined.
- ♦ Who will own and maintain the wildlife areas? How will it be funded? How will access be organised to allow community involvement and yet protect the flora and fauna?
- Why is this housing needed? Cheshire West and Chester Council's deliverable housing land supply is already well ahead of target for the current period to 2024 and a further 1000 houses will be built on Wrexham Road over the following 10 years.
- ◆ The infrastructure in terms of roads, sewerage and surface drainage south of the Dee is operating at capacity and cannot cope with additional load without significant improvement. The Council and utility companies need to develop a comprehensive plan to address the future needs of residents and businesses before agreeing to further developments.



- ◆ 1400 houses on Wrexham Road and 20 at Decoy Farm have already been approved and will seriously impact on our roads more traffic and air pollution.
- ◆ This will be a difficult project to deliver in terms of surface drainage and sewerage. The site sits on heavy clay and surrounding properties already suffer from winter flooding. Surface drainage systems need to ensure that important habitats are not polluted by run-off during and after construction.
- ♦ Residents are in two minds about access to the site Lache Lane or Winkwell Drive? There are major safety concerns about the access road proposed from Lache Lane; access via Winkwell Drive however passes close to the pond and surrounding habitat may be lost.
- ◆ The density, location and design of housing is not appropriate for this site adjacent to established housing. Density is too high; some dwellings are located very close to boundaries

- affecting privacy; some designs appear to be higher than surrounding properties. There is great demand in this area for single storey bungalows to meet the needs of an ageing population build more of these.
- ◆ Properties constructed should meet the highest environmental standards. Given the Climate Emergency declared by our Council, they should include solar panels, heat pumps, heat recovery, rainwater catchment/grey water systems as well as EV points. Gardens should be interlinked to allow wildlife to pass through.
- Parking is inadequate for residents and visitors.
 No space to turn around at the end of the road by Winkwell Drive.
- What will be the tenure of the properties freehold or leasehold? Are affordable properties for sale or rent?
- ◆ How will the management company be structured? What will their responsibilities be? (continued overleaf)

Other housing applications

Meadow House, Wrexham Road

Plans to demolish the existing building at Meadow House on Wrexham Road and construct a new house will come before the Council's Planning Committee on Tuesday 1 September. WPRA has grave concerns about the effect of the building's drainage plans on the wildlife pond at the rear of the house as well as on neighbouring properties.

It is proposed that surface water should drain into the pond which would potentially pollute it. When surveyed in 2015, this pond was found to have good biodiversity and contained great crested newts

Increasing the amount of water entering the pond is also likely to worsen the flooding that neighbouring property The Crest has been suffering since the owners of Meadow House built a conservatory five years ago. This pond is not connected to a water course and therefore water cannot flow out, other than into the gardens of neighbouring properties on Wrexham Road, Fir

Tree Avenue and Sherbourne Avenue.

Vincent Drive plans

Another project causing concern is a plan to convert the bungalow at 63 Vincent Drive into a four bedroom, two storey house.

The effect of this alteration on neighbours would be very upsetting as previously private rooms and gardens will be overlooked. Two of the neighbouring properties are bungalows and will lose most of their privacy.

One further important objection relates to the short supply of bungalows in Chester. The stock in Westminster Park is highly valued, particularly by those aiming to down-size from larger family houses. Current housing developments on Wrexham Road offer no bungalows at all. Allowing this development would set a dangerous precedent we could lose more of our single storey accommodation, just as our ageing population is expanding.

The site is currently owned by The Marjory Boddy Charitable Trust, an organisation which makes grants to local charities involved in the areas of health, education, welfare and the arts. Proceeds from the sale of the land would enable them to support more charities.







In addition, they have separated the sofas with the bar and spread the tables and chairs around their large shop to give plenty of space in which to keep people distanced from each other.

There is a station by the entrance with all the PPE stuff automatic hand sanitiser dispensers, gloves and masks which are all free of charge.

Pharmacy in danger of closing

Our pharmacy is at the heart of our community and is relied on by many local residents for the supply of medication and advice. However, it is in very real danger of closing.

Reduced funding has meant that it is a challenge for local pharmacies to meet the bills for rates, rent and staffing whilst also competing with online businesses. Over half say that they have been operating at a loss.

The NHS is trying to switch funding away from prescriptions to the provision of more services in order to reduce GP visits and A & E attendance. However, this requires investment in training and facilities which many small pharmacies like ours will find difficult.

Our pharmacy has really proved itself to be invaluable in supporting our community through the Covid-19 pandemic, and is asking you to support a petition for fairer funding. You can find it at: change.org/saveourpharmacies

Looking after our environment - save Westminster Park's hedgehogs



Hedgehogs are one of or gate. our most loved wild creatures and we are lucky to still have some although numbers.

Over the past decade a third of hedgehogs have been lost from our towns and cities and yet they are very valuable visitors as they love eating slugs and snails.

One of the main problems that they face is that it is increasingly difficult for them to move from instructions are on the Hedgehog Street website). garden to garden as we are putting up impenetrable fences.

Hedgehog Street is a charity which aims to change that and encourage us to link our gardens by making holes in our fences. Hedgehogs travel around one mile every night through our parks and gardens in their quest to find enough food and a mate. If you have an enclosed garden, you might be getting in the way of their plans.

A 13cm by 13cm hole is sufficient for any hedgehog to pass through. This will be too small for nearly all pets. This can be made by removing a brick from a wall, cutting a hole in a fence or digging a channel a tunnel under your fence, wall

If you are replacing a fence, look out for premade hedgehog-friendly gravel boards.

When you have created your hole, you put it on on Westminster Park, the Hedgehog Street charity's 'BIG hedgehog in reduced map'. You can also record any sightings of hedgehogs on here too.
