Meanwhile there is lots of activity on the Wrexham Road development of Kings Moat Village. In our September issue, we highlighted the new plans that Redrow had submitted for the parcel of land at the southern end of the site between Lache Lane and Wrexham Road. This has implications particularly for the residents of Lache Lane and Greenacre Road where the new houses interface with our existing properties. Plans are still under discussion. More recently, Taylor Wimpey have submitted an application to alter the plans which were agreed in 2019 for the building of dwellings on land adjoining properties on Sherbourne Avenue, Five Ashes Road and Rowcliffe Avenue. There is more information about this proposal in Brian Westcott's article on page 2.

It is very important that you make your voice heard in the planning process. The Planning Officers do read your comments and take them into account and the more people comment, the more they pay attention. So please look at the plans and send comments in via the Council's website or by email or letter. Once the plans are passed they will not be changed!

As the darker nights draw in, we know that we are fast approaching the festive season once again. Plans are well in hand for our **Christmas Lights Switch-On** event at the Westminster Park shops on **Thursday 1 December** to which you are all warmly invited.

Councillors' update

We have 'called in' the two live planning applications on the Wrexham Road site; Redrow (22/01679/S73) and Taylor Wimpey (22/03064/FUL), and are in discussion with the Planning Officer with regard to residents' concerns. It is expected that amended plans will be submitted by Redrow with regard to proposed changes adjacent to Lache Lane and Greenacre, and residents will be consulted once again. The Planning Officer has been in discussion with Taylor Wimpey with reference to the proposed increase in numbers of dwellings, additional height of buildings and boundary management. Amended plans are expected from the developers and residents will have the opportunity to respond to their proposed alterations. We are working with Westminster Park Residents' Association as these developments proceed and forward residents' concerns to the relevant departments so please get in touch with your thoughts. Lache Library on the move?

There is a proposal to relocate Lache Library to the Lache Community Centre. We are concerned that there has been very little consultation with users or an impact assessment for this plan. Please get in touch if you wish to express your views on this. Road Works

- A great deal of frustration has been expressed about the long-lasting road works and traffic lights sited on Lache Lane. It is good to see that some progress is being made on this. We will continue to monitor.
- We have been contacted about the issue of parking on Vincent Drive at school drop off and pick up times, particularly where this causes visibility problems, and double yellow lines have been requested. We have raised these issues with Highways who will investigate.

Bin and Gone

The large recycling bin that appeared in front of the shops has now been removed - it had been placed there without permission. **Members Budget**

We were delighted to contribute towards the purchase of tulip, crocus and snowdrop bulbs to be planted around Westminster Park. It is a pleasure to see the results of the continuing hard work of the volunteers – all of the gardening activities and the creation of wildlife habitats for bugs, birds and bats. Thank you very much to all of them, from all of us.

Taylor Wimpey and Wrexham Road development - WPRA Response

Taylor Wimpey were originally given full planning permission to build 786 dwellings on the Wrexham Road site as part of the overall application with Redrow for 1269 dwellings. TW have now submitted an application to increase the number of dwellings on the northern part of their site from 127 to 213, an increase of 86 (68%). Following a Westminster Park Residents' Association committee meeting, we have objected to the application and made the following comments:

1. We believe that the increase would make that part of the site too densely built upon and out of keeping with the rest of the site, particularly with the Westminster Park estate that it adjoins. It states that the new application would have no environmental impact on either the site or WP - we do not agree. The original plan was for 32 dwellings to back on to the 35 existing houses in Merton Drive, Rowcliffe Avenue and Five Ashes Road - this has now been increased to 53. In our view, the increase to 213 houses will adversely

affect the whole character of the site and be detrimental

to the amenity of the adjoining estate. 2. Some of the houses backing on to existing WP dwellings are planned to be 2½ storey, semi-detached houses - significantly higher than the originally proposed 2 storey houses. Sited close to the boundary, they will dominate existing gardens causing loss of privacy and reducing sunlight. We accept that TW has permission to build on the site but we think that the proposal to build 2½ storey houses shows a lack of respect to existing residents.

3. There is reference to a three metre offset between existing WP houses on Merton Drive, Rowcliffe Avenue, Five Ashes Road and Sherborne Avenue and the new ones. At the time of writing, TW has not responded to requests for information about this boundary – what will it consist of and who will maintain it.

4. The application refers to implications for the

drainage strategy and mentions feedback following consultation with the council in March 2022. It states that there is a need for an updated drainage strategy to take account of the proposed revision with supporting technical evidence. In our view, planning permission for any increase in the number of dwellings should not be given until the drainage implications have been satisfactorily resolved.

5. The application states that consultation with local communities will take place and recognises the importance of this. This TW application was not referred to at our online meeting in July with developers and we have heard nothing from them since.

Councillors Neil Sullivan and Razia Daniels have called the application in and say that it will not be considered by the council until December at the earliest so there is still time for residents to make their own comments - please do. The reference is: 22/03064/FUL.



Recently, a Scot's Pine and heather bed were planted by family, friends, colleagues and volunteers to commemorate Alan Reid, who died this year. Al was responsible for maintenance activities in the park and will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

Gardening Club news

The extraordinary summer heat is behind us, lawns have miraculously turned lush green again and now it's clear from the gaps that some plants did not survive the devastating heat/ drought assault. However, gardeners are always keen to try something new and will not need a second invitation to visit local nurseries and garden centres to seek out replacements. Don't forget to keep an eye out on the plant shelter by the Co-op as donations appear there from time-to-time.

During December, take care that vulnerable plants are protected from frost damage. Other jobs for the 'to do' list include:

- · Continue feeding birds, ensuring seed and other edibles are safe from mice
- Prune fruit trees that grow in open areas to prevent freezing of extremities.
- · Check that your greenhouse and pond heaters are working
- Harvest winter crops like cabbage and root veg
- Insulate outdoor taps
- Prune vines early in the month
- Plant or transplant deciduous shrubs and trees
- Take cuttings from hardwood trees
- Finally, enjoy cosy indoor 'gardening' chores, such as planning, perhaps with the aid of seed catalogues!

Activities being planned for 2023 include a visit to the Winter Garden at Dunham Massey (self drive/car share) on Friday 27 January, plus spring and autumn trips to RHS Bridgewater (self drive/car share) to see the progress of this new garden endeavour.
