Thank you to all of you who came to our special **Christmas Lights Switch-on** at the WP shops in December. The lights in the trees opposite the shops have been functioning erratically and it has been decided to rewire them. This will involve quite a lot of expenditure, some of which will be paid for by your subscriptions. We would also be very



grateful for any donations to help fund it.

Work continues on the Wrexham Road housing development with consequent disruption on Lache Lane, Circular Drive, Whaddon Drive and Greenacre Road in connection with the provision of sewerage services. I would like to thank Peter Cocker, from our Wrexham Road subcommittee, for monitoring the work on behalf of WPRA and communicating so effectively with the Council, the contractors and residents.

I am greatly saddened to report the passing of Bob Tricklebank, another member of that committee for many years. Bob had a great eye for detail when examining plans and assessing proposals and his wise counsel will be missed by all of us. We pass on our deepest sympathies to his family.

Recent work on the Wrexham Road site has involved the felling of trees and removal of hedges which must be done between October and March to avoid disturbing nesting birds. On land adjacent to Greenacre Road a number of trees, marked for preservation, have been felled apparently by mistake. My thanks go to local residents for drawing this to the attention of our councillors so quickly. It serves to show that we must all remain aware of the potential destruction of natural resources which the developers have said will be conserved.

Ground clearance has also started on the Local Wildlife Site between Lache Lane and Winkwell Drive where trees have been felled on the lane leading to the site, so this small green enclave is also about to be built upon. I am sure we will be keeping a close eye on the works as they progress.

Following the success of our Community Tidy Up last September we are hoping to organise another one during the Spring. Watch our website and FB page.

Finally, we are always happy to hear from you if you have suggestions or ideas about how our neighbourhood can be improved.

News from your Councillors

No crossing, as yet

In response to queries raised by local residents, councillors requested that two separate assessments be undertaken by the Highways department on the Wrexham Road near the Ashgrove nursery. Both gave the result that the volume of traffic on this stretch of the road is not at a level where a safe crossing is required. As traffic is increasing, councillors have asked that this be kept under review and have offered funds from their members' budget towards another assessment in the future.

Making good

Although the works on Whaddon Drive were completed in January, there remains much damage to the road, pavements and grass verges to be fully repaired. Residents' concerns have been communicated to the Highways Officers and we have been informed that CW&C will meet the developers and the contractor to agree a plan and a timetable, in line with legislation. It is noted that although the repairs are to be undertaken as soon as possible, some may have to be delayed until better weather arrives in spring.

Pavement clear up

After years of neglect, work was finally done on Overleigh Road, Grosvenor Bridge, Wrexham Road and Lache Lane to clear the pavements and make it safe for pedestrians to walk.

Air Investigation

Following our request that the air quality near schools be monitored, a device has been installed to measure the quantity of nitrogen dioxide in the air on the Old Wrexham Road. Monitoring will continue for at least 12 months and results will be published on the council website next year.

Westminster Park Activity

We would like to thank volunteers for the amazing work they are all doing in Westminster Park; creating a pond and paths, planting trees and wild flowers and much more.

BMX will be back in business

We asked Highways to inspect the condition of the BMX track at Westminster Park as a recent Royal Society for Prevention of Accidents inspection had identified the need for new surfacing. There is funding to cover the cost of the restoration and repair work will take place as soon as possible.

Croquet Pavilion

The refurbishment of the exterior of this building will be undertaken by the council within the financial year. We are also continuing to work with Park staff to find a reliable and cost effective water sprinkling system.

Councillors' Budget

We were delighted to award funds to undertake repair work and rewiring of the Christmas lights and to purchase wild flowers seeds for the Park.

Wildlife areas in Westminster Park

Friends of Westminster Park volunteers continue to plan and work on various projects in the park and have recently been visited by wildlife experts from Chester Zoo who were impressed by progress so far. There are now plans for volunteers to assist Zoo outreach staff when local schools bring pupils to explore the wildlife sites in the park.

The work schedule for spring includes spreading a mulch of shredded Christmas trees on path surfaces through the woods and in the dog run area. The pond, recently lined with puddling clay (kindly supplied by Councillor Neil Sullivan), has been encircled with branches to deter dogs from going in and getting covered with sticky mud. Lots of log piles and turf mounds have



been created for wildlife to inhabit. Keep an eye out for information boards in the near future. Anyone who would like to be involved is welcome to join in on any Wednesday, 10-12, currently in the area near the BMX track. Boots and gloves are essential, as are a few garden tools whilst safety glasses are advised. The volunteers are appealing for bird and bat boxes, if anyone would like to make a few – please contact them for a template. They also need sand, pebbles and sandstone blocks for use in the wildlife area. More information is available from



CO-OP Re-cycling
