* Lache Project. A meeting was held to discuss the progress of the Lache Master Plan listed four emerging projects:

- traffic management and road congestion, currently being investigated by the highways department;
- the play area on Sycamore Fields and the equipment to be provided;
- the future of the Backies (currently an unmaintained green space);
- an environmental study taking place on The Sidings area in May to assess wildlife and ecoloav.

Residents are being invited to comment upon and make suggestions for the play area, anticipated to be opened by March 2024. A steering group, including local residents, has been created to have a role in the future of the Backies, where future housing development has been discounted in the light of local opposition. Funding for its future would be sought from monies available from

off-site ecological sums allocated following development elsewhere in the region. The future of the Sidings is undecided, pending the results of the forthcoming survey; again, local opinion is firmly against the development of remaining green space.

* Local school provision. The increase in the number of houses in our area together with the arrival of refugees at the Holiday Inn has put a lot of pressure on our local schools. WPRA and other local residents' associations are meeting in the near future with the Education Officer in charge of school provision for an update on the plan to increase places. We will put information about the meeting on our website.

As ever, if you have any suggestions for the improvement of our neighbourhood or wish to get involved with the residents' association, please get in touch. Or better still, come along to our AGM at 8pm on Wednesday 19 April to find our what we do and share your ideas. I look forward to seeing you soon.

We have received many complaints about the lack of maintenance of our streets which we continue to report to the Council, requesting urgent attention. There is some progress to note:

- Traffic management between Green Lane and Decoy Farm has been removed and the new footpath completed.
- The road works have finally been completed on Whaddon Drive and the

- After our recent street surgery, the large pothole on Claypit Road was reported and promptly repaired.
- The Highways department has rejected a request for angled parking and a one way system on the Westminster Park shops car park as it would reduce the number of spaces available and increase traffic on Five Ashes Road in the vicinity of the school. The car park surface is in a poor condition and we have asked for this to be treated as a priority by Highways.

Housing issues

- The Section 73 application for Redrow is being dealt with. The local residents' group worked very effectively to get a positive outcome. The Taylor Wimpey planning application will now need to be addressed.
- Works on the Blue Oaks development are causing problems with contractors' vehicles, building site traffic, damage to grass verges and mud on Lache Lane and Rowcliffe Avenue. We have requested that the Planning department takes a strong line over this and these issues have been raised with the developers.

Building a school for the Wrexham Road development

An update on the provision of a new primary school for the Wrexham Road development is

against the Government's anti-strike bill.

The series of talks organised by the Grosvenor Museum Society continues through spring. On Tuesday 14 March at 2.30pm, Mike Royden describes the last voyage of RMS Lusitania and the liner's link with Farndon. Doors open at 2pm and complimentary tea, coffee and biscuits are available.
