Razia Daniels writes:

I am delighted to have been re-elected as councillor for Handbridge Park and thank everyone who voted for me. I would also like to pay tribute to my former colleague Neil Sullivan for his many years of hard work and commitment to the residents of Handbridge Park ward.

I will continue to pursue the issues you have told me matter most to you, including securing investment for roads and pavements, road safety, Chester Western Relief Road, improving maintenance of green spaces,

scrutinising local planning applications to protect our environment, improvements to Westminster Park Golf shop, café, changing rooms and disabled toilets, and campaigning for a new school and GP surgery for the local area.

Taylor Wimpey planning application

At a planning committee meeting in April, we objected to this application for a further 212 homes on the Wrexham Road site. After deliberation, the application was unanimously rejected.

Telecomms Mast

Cheshire West and Chester Council have received a Notification of Application under the Planning Act for 5G telecoms installation (ref number: 23/01418/TEL) for a15m street pole and additional equipment cabinets at Castle Croft Road, Chester, CH4 7QD. We responded to the pre-consultation (reference CHE25007):

- The mast is too big and out of keeping with a residential area.
- The proposed site is in the vicinity of Belgrave Primary School.

- The mast and cabinets may obstruct sight lines for road users at the junction.
- It will spoil the look of a community garden I funded for local residents.

•

- At the Westminster Park Residents' Association AGM there was unanimous objection to this proposal and many emails opposing this have been received and forwarded to the planning department
- It was requested that residents' concerns are taken into consideration and that another location for the 5G mast is found.

New Councillor gets to work

Firstly, a big heartfelt thank you, to all those who voted for me in the local elections. I hope I can respond by being an approachable, active councillor, working for the residents of Handbridge Park, pursuing my five local pledges:

- Action on sewage dumping in the River Dee
- Tackling littering and fly tipping
- · Supporting local shopping areas
- Tackling speeding & road safety issues
- Supporting efforts of residents in green and community spaces

Recently, residents on Vincent Drive have been in touch about issues caused by school

time parking on bends, in unsafe locations and blocking residents' drives.

Speeding issues have been raised across the ward and I am in the process of liaising with the local PCSO and Highways to see if more monitoring can be done, and if any traffic calming measures can be put in.

When the River Dee suddenly turned a murky, reddish brown colour, through contact with the environmental agency I was able to establish that this was likely to be due to a collapsed river bank and a big fall of rain. I will continue to highlight and work alongside the Member of Parliament to make sure Chester's river can be cleaned up for people to swim safely in it.

I am looking forward to meeting with the

Friends of Westminster Park to look over the many improvements they have made in the park and to see what further help might be needed for this valuable work to progress. Getting the café in the park renovated and open consistently will also be a key part of the five pledges listed above.

I will be spending time locally, listening to issues raised by residents and keeping in touch with projects and work undertaken for the benefit of the community by local people.

Friends of Westminster Park: Spectacular Growth

Spring has sprung in Westminster Park and hard work earlier in the year by the Friends of Westminster Park volunteers has resulted in blooms and blossom throughout the park. It's a delight to see tulips and alliums in the more formal beds (thanks to Councillors, Razia and Neil, for funding the bulbs); hedges that were laid are now in full leaf and flower, providing low, thick growth for small mammals and birds to nest and forage in safely and fruit trees are dressed in full blossom, promising good crops later. Foxgloves, hollyhocks and aquilegia have been planted in the woodland.

We haven't been the only volunteers – we hosted a visit from Lache Primary Willows Group and Belgrave Primary Eco Group when children planted wildflowers in specially prepared beds in the wildflower meadow. After our appeal last year, we are so grateful to members of the WP Gardening Club who delivered a carpet of wildflowers specially grown from seed to be added to the wildflower river and the new area by the orchard. It will look even more spectacular than last year.

More and more people are discovering this truly special green space on our doorstep (see Olwen's letter). Over 90 people recently walked around the area at an event for the City Nature Challenge, supported by Chester Zoo. Using an app called iNaturalist, they spotted plants and trees on their journey round the woodland and meadow.

Of course, we are also delighted to welcome (more informally) the great variety of wildlife that has been spotted: foxes, frogs and newts, stoats, voles; damselflies and possibly badgers.....

Do come and visit and, if you sit down to appreciate the calm beauty of it all, check first to make sure that we haven't just painted the bench as we are now looking after those too!

New volunteers are always welcome – there is a wide variety of tasks. We meet every Wednesday, 10-12. Look out for gardeners wearing yellow vests!


Talk of Murders and Riots at the Museum

It's been a very satisfying season of talks for members and guests of the Grosvenor Museum Society, including one to celebrate the publication of a book written by the late Peter Boughton, the much-missed Keeper of Art at the museum. Ian Dunn, Peter's collaborator, completed the book and gave a special lecture on its subject, George Cuitt the Younger, whose early 19th century etchings depict many of the famous landmarks in Chester. The Grosvenor Museum has a comprehensive collection of the etchings which will be the focus of a special exhibition next year. Copies of the book are available at the Museum shop. Next season's lecture programme is nearly complete. The first two are:

Tuesday 12 September - Liverpool Murders and Misdemeanours by Ken Pye

Tuesday 17 October - The Kinmel Bay Riots by Celia Drew.

Staying Sharp in the Driving Seat

Taking your place behind the wheel generally feels completely natural and the skills required seem instinctively easy. But what can we do when confidence begins to fade and concern about driving on today's busy roads increases? These concerns are not groundless as national statistics show a steep increase in injuries in car drivers and passengers where the driver is aged 75 and older.

At a recent 'Drive Safer for Longer' workshop, held at the Community Centre, a group of Westminster Park residents took steps towards reassurance – after all, a responsible driver is an aware driver.

Led by friendly, informative officers from Cheshire West and Chester Road Safety department and two

driving instructors, the group explored many areas of concern for older drivers, including:

- personal health deteriorating eyesight, medication (including over-the-counter drugs) that can affect perception
- mental preparation speed of perception and reaction can be reduced
- lifestyle the effects of drugs, alcohol, tiredness
- car suitability features to look for in a car that will assist an older driver

The session covered many issues, including the difficult question of when it is timely to give up driving and make use of other means of transport and the emphasis was on making personal choices and remaining aware of one's own capabilities.

Attendees were offered the opportunity to book an informal driving assessment by a local driving instructor – all with the aim of keeping people driving safely for longer and maintaining this important facet of independence.

Feedback from one person after her driving



assessment was that it was not exactly relaxing but not too terrifying either. She reported that she got plenty of sensible advice on assessing road hazards to help improve her reading of the road. The comment that: 'Speed limits are not just advisory', was somewhat chastening as she said she considered herself to be pretty law abiding, but the point has very much been taken on board!

Please object to this 5G mast near the Coop

Planning application 23/01418/TEL has been submitted to the Council to erect a 15 metre high mast and large cabinets close to the Coop at Westminster Park shops. WPRA is aware that 5G masts are needed, but considers this to be the wrong place and urges you to object. The more objections received, the more the Council listens, so please don't think it's not worth doing!

The key points of objection are:

• 2m tall cabinets will cause **road safety problems** by interfering with the line of sight of motorists and cyclists using the car park.

• They will **interfere with the line of sight** of **pedestrians** crossing the car park entrance.

• Narrowing this busy pavement will **cause congestion and upset**. The Site Plan does not show the electric scooter park.

• The adjacent wall is used as a resting place by those visiting the shops or waiting for the bus. This amenity will be lost.

• At more than double height of surrounding buildings, the pole will dominate the area. The Proposed Site Elevation drawing is very misleading, showing tall trees

close to the pole which do not exist. The pole will be highly visible and have an adverse effect on the character and appearance of the area.


• Residents living nearby are very upset at the prospect of their outlook being changed. **Their visual amenity will be lost**. This equipment also emits noise which will be disturbing to local residents.

We have worked hard to

improve the attractiveness of this area by planting trees and installing planters. It is where our Christmas tree is sited and is the location of Incredible Edible's raised beds.

 The plans are inaccurate and misleading and the search for sites has not been robust.

Our view is that this application should be refused and a more suitable location should be found such as Westminster Park. Every objection counts, so please comment now. Quote planning application number: 23/01418/TEL, your name and address. The
