## Notes from The Chair

Welcome to our December issue of WP News.
We have had a busy autumn with a sell out quiz at the Community Centre, a public meeting to discuss new plans released by Taylor Wimpey for their site behind Five Ashes/Rowcliffe Avenue and Sherbourne Avenue and most recently the announcement by the Council that they have decided to hold a competition to appoint an academy trust to establish and run the new Kings Moat school.

## Taylor Wimpey plans

Following the refusal of their previous plans, Taylor Wimpey (TW) have come back with new plans and a willingness to seek the views of local residents. Further to our earlier objections that the planned houses backing on to WP residents' homes were not of a similar size and character, TW have redesigned the boundary houses to reflect neighbouring properties more closely. They are also consulting on the nature and ownership of the boundary buffer area. A lively public meeting was held on 24 October to give residents the opportunity to view the plans and air their views - thank you to all who came.

## Consultation on New School

Your views are sought as part of a consultation about the new school to be built on the Kings Moat estate. The 6 week consultation period will run until 17 December 2023. You can contribute via the Council's website or by email. Feedback will be used to help formulate the Council's specification for the new school issued to trusts competing to run the school.

## Christmas Lights Switch-on

Our ever popular Christmas event is taking place on Tuesday 5 December and I do hope that you can join us to hear the Belgrave choir sing and celebrate the start of the Christmas season in Westminster Park. This autumn, I enjoyed working with local volunteers who turn up for everything from the Tidy Up outside the Westminster Park shops; Friends of Westminster Park and the sports' groups that use the park; WP Residents' Association meetings about planning debates on further development at Kings Moat. It is really good to see how local people get involved in the day-to-day business of the area and its future. If you have any comments and suggestions about any of these issues, please contact me if you would like me to raise them on your behalf.
It was good to visit the WP Croquet Club as it held a national final competition, attracting people from all over the country. This club is partially managed by the local authority, unlike many other croquet clubs, and is always keen to welcome new members. Local ward budget funds have been authorised for bulb planting at the park and the annual Christmas lights' switch on at Westminster Park shops.

## Razia Daniels:

I continue to champion the installation of a safe pedestrian crossing and new paving across the Wrexham Road near Ash Grove and thank the many residents who signed the petition.
I was pleased to attend the public meeting to share information about the revised Taylor Wimpey proposals for further house building in the Westminster Park area. This is on-going, so I will continue to monitor the application in order to represent you.
Having received many comments and concerns about the traffic along Lache Park Avenue, I have contributed funding from
my members' budget to the Highways Department for a speed and traffic volume survey and will share the results in due
course. Pavements on Marlston Avenue and Rydal Grove have been improved after a report about their poor state.
Police Crime Commissioner John Dwyer has tasked an independent organisation, Victim Focus, to carry out a survey of women and girls in Cheshire aged $16+$ about personal safety, crime and their experiences with the police. It is vital to hear from girls aged $16-17$ as they are particularly likely to be victims of crime, but are often missed in other surveys as they are children. The survey is open until midday, Friday 1 December: https://freeonlinesurveys.com/s/2mpYbKv. You do not need to have been a victim of crime to take part.
