Recently, I met PCSO Jones for a walk around Westminster Park and raised a few local concerns: parking, speeding and anti-social behaviour. As a result, she has had access to the speed gun to monitor speeds locally.

At the Westminster Park Christmas Light Switch-on, Belgrave school children's singing was great, even if it did make me feel guite old not recognising the school Christmas songs! A big thank you to the Lord Mayor for doing the official countdown - I am sure she was very busy across Chester attending lots of other Christmas events.

I attended a further meeting with Taylor Wimpey about stage 3 of the Wrexham Road development. I felt the meeting was open and honest and was glad to see that residents' concerns are still being discussed through communication with members of the Westminster Park Residents' Association. It is likely that the application will be heard at planning in March; if you want to raise any further concerns please get in touch.

In early January I visited the new Green Day café in Westminster Park; the place looks great and I hope it will thrive in the park and will get plenty of local support.

Green Day café: I am delighted to see the café reopening in Westminster Park and enhancements made to the golf course, setting a positive tone for the new year. I have already received fantastic feedback about its coffee and cake! After a resident contacted me regarding the absence of accessible toilets in the Park, I raised this with the Council and also requested an update on improvements to the changing rooms.

Planning Application - Taylor Wimpey: Thanks to the Chair of WPRA, Jennifer Crew, for organising a meeting at the Community Centre to discuss residents' concerns about the on-going development proposals. TW have made some adjustments to their planning application; it is expected revised plans will be submitted shortly. I have called in the application and will do my best to represent residents' concerns when it is in front of the Planning Committee.

Planning Application - No.1 Lakeside Chester Business CH4 9QT: A planning application has been submitted for a part change of use to accommodate a mental health care facility, replacement windows, installation of PV panels and electric vehicle charging points with the remainder of the building continuing with Class E(g) activities: a dispensary and an IT and archive facility. More details are on the Cheshire West and Chester council website (planning applications) reference: 24/00096/FUL

Flooding issues: I have received concerns about flooding on Wrexham Road, Overleigh

Roundabout and Kings Moat Garden Village which I reported to the appropriate departments, asking them to look into the various matters raised. I have also asked Highways to clear the blockage of road gullies which have not been maintained for a very long time.

Libraries and Museums: Council is asking for residents' views on these services and for feedback on a number of proposals on how they could operate in the future. These include changes to opening hours. The proposed changes have been designed using usage data and local knowledge to ensure that excellent services continue to be available to residents. If you wish to take part in the consultation, please ensure that your survey is submitted by Tuesday 2 April. Full details can be found here: cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk/ librariesandmuseums. Consultation documents and survey will also be available at all Cheshire West libraries and museums. #### **Community First Aid**

Let's give a 'heartfelt' welcome to the addition to the facilities offered at Westminster Park shops – the brand new defibrillator that has been installed outside Bebbington & Williams Fishmonger.

According to the British Heart Foundation, every year around 30,000 people are struck by sudden cardiac arrest whilst going about their daily lives and when this occurs, it's essential that resuscitation is carried out as soon as possible. The defibrillator is a portable device that has the capability to determine whether to administer high-energy electric shocks and is a vital tool that can massively increase the chance of survival. It can be used by anyone as it gives verbal instructions on its application and will NOT function if not needed, so there's no chance of giving an unnecessary electric shock.

WPRA has purchased the defibrillator with two generous anonymous donations



so there are now three in the area – the others being inside the Community Centre and at Glan Aber Tennis Club in the park.

The Residents' Association has also arranged for a free first aid course, which is being offered to community groups by the Red Cross. Whilst the 90-minute session does not lead to a qualification, it will give instruction on effective first aid, including the use of the defibrillator. It will be held at the Community Centre on Thursday 14 March, 2-4pm and

#### WPRA working to improve Taylor Wimpey plans

Members of WPRA's Wrexham Road Development sub-committee have continued to meet with Taylor Wimpey, the Council's Planning Officer and our Councillors to work towards improvements to the plans submitted by the builder for Phase 3 of their site (Planning Application 23/003377/FUL).

In response to our requests, they have taken a number of actions:

- Revised the composition of houses planned on the boundary, reducing the number backing onto Rowcliffe Avenue and Five Ashes Road from 33 to 24.
- Moved all 2.5 storey properties planned for the boundary to positions further into the development, including those on the southern section which were approved under the original application.
- Agreed that the existing surveyed boundary line will be upheld and all existing garden extensions will be retained by WP residents.
- Agreed to install a French drain along the boundary.

There remain areas for discussion regarding the boundary position and treatment. Residents are welcome to contact Jennifer Crew for further information or to discuss the plans. The application is still open on the Council website for comments.

#### Looking forward to spring — news from Friends of Westminster Park

As we all know, there's been lots of rain and the area beside the pond is still very muddy but we are making good progress chipping the mountain of Christmas trees, so the paths through the woods are looking and smelling great. Another section of the bramble patch has been tamed – they will re-grow but will be lower and have better fruits. Small mammals and birds which like to forage close to the ground will thrive in this type of habitat.

In November, we helped council workers to prune the lower branches of the tall conifers to give the car park a welcome spruce up. On the same day we were also busy tiding shrubs at the main gate and Lache Lane gate. Cliveden Road entrance



Lane gate. Cliveden Road entrance has been transformed and we are all looking forward to the spring bulbs, summer flowers and autumn colour. You may have noticed we are working on the hedge between the cafe and the football pitches. This hedge is at least 150 years old and needed a lot of attention. A number of the trees were dead and being held up by ivy. Now removed, we are laying the rest and planting new whips (saplings) which were free native species from the Woodland Trust: English oak, blackthorn, hazel, hawthorn and dog rose. With careful management, the hedge should be good for another 150 years, creating a terrific habitat

for birds, small mammals and insects.

In the next few weeks, we'll be planting autumn flowering bulbs and putting up new bird boxes. Builders took down the old wall at the back

The WPRA website is in great need of a design update - could you be just the person to give it a smart new look?


We set up our website many years ago using WordPress and it has served us well, but it is now looking a tad out of date and needs to be given a redesign.

#### Getting out there...

One of the main aims of this newsletter is to give details of activities available to residents in our community in the hope that everyone can find something of interest in which to participate or get support. A community that shares pastimes and undertakes joint enterprises can rightly be judged to be caring and considerate and as we get to know each other better it's likely that good neighbourliness will become an even more valued feature of living in Westminster Park. This could particularly apply to those who are living alone or find themselves solo in a social situation.

Just a quick survey of WPRA committee members led to a big list of suggestions of clubs, meeting places, sources of support and information plus personal endorsements for the friendliness and assured welcome to be found at those organisations regularly mentioned in the newsletter:

Evergreen 55+; Handbridge WI; NWR; exercise, social and sports clubs at the Community Centre; Sundays with Incredible Edible, Wednesdays with the Friends of Westminster Park; the Gardening Club to name but a few that feature regularly in this newsletter.

Even so, it can feel daunting to go along to an organised gathering with some groups only offering one trial visit before expecting you to join so it could be a good idea to find your feet at a variety of informal, drop-in sessions first. Happily, we are extremely lucky to have on hand the **Lache Park Avenue Library** where entertainment, computers, access to wifi and friendly company can be found. During the 5 days that the library is open (open hours printed below) you can take part in:

- Sociable Scrabble on Mondays 10am-12.30pm
- Craft and Chat on Tuesdays 2.15-3.13pm bring your own knitting, crochet or sewing
- **Relish Reading** on Fridays 10-11am read the short story provided and talk about it afterwards, or just listen!
- Colouring and Coffee on Fridays 2.30-3.30pm – for adults, patterns and pencils provided, or bring your own

- For parents and carers with children:
- Lego Club on Saturdays 10-11 for over-6s to get creative with fellow builders (adult supervision required)
- Baby Explorers on Tuesdays in term time, 10.30-11.30 for new parents to introduce their little ones to sensory play
- **Rhymetime** on Thursdays in term time, 2.15-2.45pm for babies and toddlers to play with musical instruments, toys, songs and rhymes

All of these sessions are FREE. Where refreshments are offered, a small charge is made.

The Library is also a great starting point if you need help or guidance on welfare, health, digital assistance; it offers signposts to organisations that can advise on social services, benefits, housing options, transport and staying independent. You can find the help you need from the many posters and leaflets within the library or talk to one of the library assistants who are able to make referrals to relevant supporting bodies whilst offering a sympathetic listening ear.

If you would like to combine a chat with a visit to the Park, **Green Day Café** has just become a **Chatty Café** venue. This is an award-winning scheme that creates a space for people to talk; whether it is for five minutes while you drink a brew, or an hour of good conversation.

Initially, there will a table or two designated for those who have come into the café looking for a chat in addition to a drink, but Green Day would like to have volunteers who will come in regularly to sit at the table for a while to host a conversation session with customers who take a seat.

There is a training programme designed by Chatty Cafe which can be found on their website: thechattycafescheme.co.uk and, of course, volunteering is another very worthwhile way of getting out and about to meet people.



Specifically for older people, there is also the much-valued **Silver Line**, run by Age UK, which offers information and support over the telephone, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. It's

#### Local international cinema

Chester International Film Festival is underway at Storyhouse, running until 8 March. Highlighting the very best in international cinema (including pre-release previews) and incorporating the Animation Festival, it's curated by Chester Film Society in partnership with Storyhouse and The University of Chester. Tickets cost £7, £4 for under-25s; card payments only.

There will be no trailers and each film will be introduced by a lecturer from the University of Chester's Department of Languages and Cultures. The Audience Awards will be presented to best film in the season and best entry to the Animation Festival.

#### **Proposal for Mental Health Hospital on Chester Business Park**

Plans have been submitted to the Council by Cygnet Health Care for the establishment of a new mental health hospital and pharmaceutical store at One Lakeside, a large building adjacent to the ponds at the Park & Ride Roundabout.

The intention is to convert it into a specialist mental health hospital, with supporting offices, pharmacy, IT and archive facility. The applicants claim that it will "bring social value through employment, investment and environmental benefit to the local area".

The hospital will provide a mental health care facility offering 52 en suite urgent admission beds to meet the acute needs of men and women requiring access to mental health services, including intensive care in a Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU). Local facilities are in short supply with many patients currently being cared for outside of the local area.

The proposed facility will not have an A&E department. The numbers of patients arriving and leaving the hospital will be far fewer than a typical hospital, but 427 staff will be required to care for them.

Cygnet state that whilst people may be concerned about individuals requiring mental health care, "we can offer our assurance that this is not a place of containment (sometimes referred to as a low or medium secure unit), rather it is a place of sanctuary," and that "security standards are in place for the safety of the individuals who stay and receive care on site".

Comments submitted to the Council have focused on the safety of local people, the safety of patients (given the close proximity of the site to the 50mph Wrexham Road and 70mph A55), the lack of local amenities and the inappropriateness of changing the use of the building on the Business Park from high

quality office space to a healthcare facility. In addition, it is some distance away from the other acute mental health facilities in the local area.
